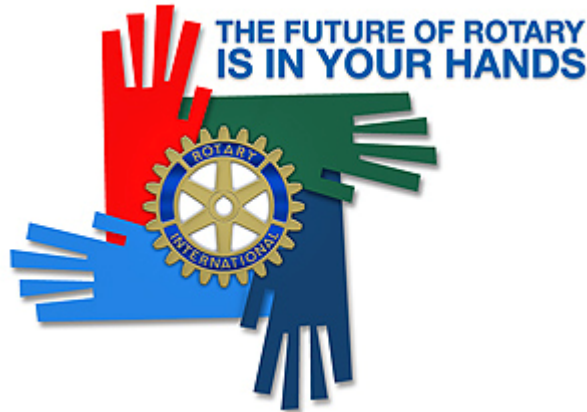

The Pal-Mac Interact Club led our meeting today. The group present was made up of the following students: Kyle Doyle, Amanda Bracy, Julianna Vecchioti, Danielle Henning, and Ann Marie Agness, along with teacher Interact representative Lisa Winkler. Each student took turns presenting the normal club business, such as leading the prayer, introducing guests, and asking for birthdays, anniversaries, happy bucks, and confessions. The students also asked a series of questions to raise money for Relay for Life, such as, ‘Give a dollar if you received a Mother’s Day present.’ Or, “Give a dollar if you know someone who attended the prom this past weekend.”

The students went on to tell about the major events and fundraisers that their club participants in annually. The Mr. Pal-Mac Contest is in its third year, and the club is looking for ways to raise more funds through this event. The club also volunteers to work at the Christmas Shop at the Primary and Intermediate schools. Interactors help wrap presents and help younger students pick out presents for their family members.

The Haunted Hayride fundraiser is another favorite event of the club. Several thousands of dollars is donated to The March of Dimes each year, and about 15 volunteers for interact work for 3-4 weekends covering shifts at the event. The Teddy Dance at St. John Fisher is yet another event the students participate in. This is an all-night dance to raise money for Camp Good Days and Special Times. The Pal-Mac Interact Club has participated in this event for the past 7 years. Relay for Life, which our club raised a total of \$70 toward in today’s meeting, benefits the American Cancer

Society. Participants walk throughout the night to remember loved ones lost to the battle of cancer.

Finally, the club participants in the Angel Tree program locally. They collect money and presents for underprivileged children and participate in wrapping and sorting them for distribution. They also help with food pantry distributions at St. Patrick's Church in Macedon.

Certificates of appreciation/accomplishment were presented to each Interact student who was present and also to Dave Read, the Rotary Club advisor to the Interact Club. This is a great group of young adults who are working to make our community, and in turn, the world, a better place by giving back to others.
